Presentation:

Introduction to CW (Part 1 of 2): Presented by Cliff (AG7CC) and Ramsey (KI7BSW) this presentation is geared for those hams who are struggling to get proficient enough to make that first contact. Although not exclusive, the presentation welcomes hams from all levels of CW experience.

Initially, it is a story about How and Why 2 local hams got into CW. In this age of No-Code Amateur Radio Service licensing, it recounts their success and failures. The experience is rendered into poignant heuristics, such as, it takes several methods (there is not just one golden pill method). Also, everyone learns a little differently (design a method to match your learning style and at your own pace). Lastly, necessity dictates how quickly you will pick up code. Following the first presentation, the participant will be able to decide if CW is for them, and what objectives are necessary to effectuate that reality.

The first presentation will lightly cover those programs, apps and equipment aides used to to become proficient in CW. Importantly, it presents a group of like-minded individuals, who want to become proficient with CW. We have created ways where we can practice code in class, or from home. Essentially, it gives the participant the flexibility to practice at their own pace, and to receive feedback (to mitigate bad habits early and to provide direction for enhanced learning).

The second part will be presented during the February 27, 2019 Monthly Meeting. The meeting will take place at the same time at the same place. The January meeting was adjourned at 1943 hours. Don't forget to pay your dues.
